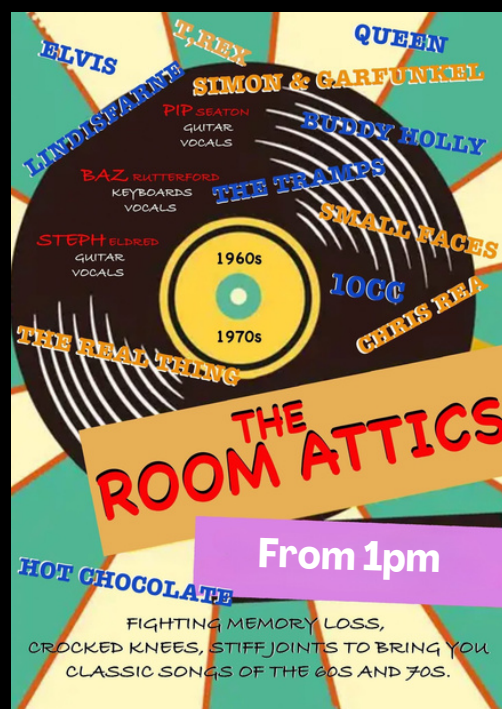

AB910 - Brief History



Supermarine Spitfire AB910 is a historic Mk Vb combat veteran built in July 1941 at Castle Bromwich. It flew 143 operational sorties during WWII.

Wartime Service

- **1941: Delivered to No. 222 Squadron at RAF North Weald in August 1941, flying early escort and sweeps.**
- **1942: Dieppe Raid. Flew four sorties during Operation Jubilee, where pilot Fg Off Eric Doorly shot down a German Dornier Do 217 bomber.**
- **1944: D-Day. Operated with 402 Squadron flying defensive and offensive beachhead patrols over Normandy.**
- **Later Duties: Served with training and radar calibration units.**

Post-War and BBMF Career

- **Civil Racing: Demobbed and bought by Group Captain Allan Wheeler, flying under the civil registration G-AISU and competing in air races.**
- **Vickers-Armstrong: Returned to Vickers and heavily demonstrated by chief test pilot Jeffrey Quill.**
- **BBMF Acquisition: Donated to the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight on September 15, 1965, by Jeffrey Quill on his final flight in a Spitfire where it is maintained in active flying condition.**

TE311 - Brief History



Supermarine Spitfire TE311 is a Mk XVIe aircraft built at Castle Bromwich and accepted by the RAF on June 8, 1945, missing WWII combat.

Post-War Military Service

- **Built with a low-back fuselage, bubble canopy, clipped wingtips, and a Rolls-Royce Merlin 266 engine.**
- **Training and Trials Units: Flown briefly by the Empire Central Flying School.**
- **Grounded Status: Formally retired from active service and transferred to non-effective stock on December 13, 1954.**

Movie Career and BBMF restoration

- **1955: Displayed statically at RAF Tangmere.**
- **Modified temporarily to resemble a Mk I Spitfire for film use.**
- **RAF Exhibition Flight: Spent 30 years as a static display and recruitment airshow exhibit.**
- **199: Arrived at Coningsby for spares.**
- **2000 - 2012: Rebuilt meticulously by BBMF technicians over 11 years, making its triumphant return to flight on October 19, 2012, 58 years after being grounded.**
